How to build your Christingle collection candle



Insert flaps A, B, C and D into the four slots in tab 1. Tab 1 should now be hidden.



Fold tabs 2, 3 and 4, in that order, towards the inside of the box so that they are flat.

Secure the bottom of your candle by inserting the two flaps on tab 5 into tab 4.



At the top of the candle, fold tabs 6 and 7 down. Insert flap E into tab 6 and flap F into tab 7. Flap G should then be inserted into the gap in front and concealed.



Fold over the tab with the flame on it so the flame pops up and stands straight. Secure this flap by tucking it into the gap behind the slot.

Now you've built your candle, it's time to fill it up!
