KS1 1) Henry Trengrouse was born in Helston in 1772. 2)He became a cabinet maker. 3) In 1807 he witnessed the sinking of the "Anson" off the Loe Bar and decided to invent life-saving equipment. 4) He invented the rocket powered rescue system for ships in distress, which he named the <i>Bosun's Chair</i> . 5)He also invented the life jacket. 6) The government ordered twenty of Trengrouse's rescue systems but decided to make it for themselves, giving Trengrouse only £50!					

		7)The Czar of Russia gave Trengrouse a diamond ring in recognition of lives saved in the Baltic using his invention. 8) Trengrouse spent his whole life in Helston. His name is commemorated in the name of a road there
