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Woodland Recovery 2020 & Derek Thomas MP

As you may already have read on our FB post Derek Thomas MP is working with The Woodland Trust in this initiative to plant 20,000 trees by the end of 2020.



Originally our saplings were due to arrive in the summer term but the pandemic delayed this. Trees have arrived but we have delayed sending these home as they are much larger trees (when fully grown) than we were expecting. The varieties we have received are Downy Birch, Goat Willow, Hazel and Crab Apple. Due to the potential size these trees can grow, careful consideration needs to be given when planting. It may be possible to repot your sapling into a large patio container to restrict its growth The Woodland Trust has an alphabetical list giving lots of information about each tree including its potential size - do you have space to plant such a tree?

entitled to a free piece of fruit or vegetable every day which is provided in school (seasonal). We encourage all children to have a piece of fruit during morning break and would ask that children in Years 3 to 6 bring a piece of fruit each day.



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Terracycle - Recycling - £572.50 to date

All raised by recycling plastic! Thank you to everyone who supports this and in turn helps the environment by diverting plastic waste from incineration and landfill. Over 14kg of crisp packets were sent off last week. The following brigade boxes are currently below the minimum weight and need more added before being sent off: biscuit, cracker and cake wrappers; stretchy plastic bread bags: writing instruments (any type of plastic pen, ink, marker, highlighter or colouring). It is important that all recycling is sorted into its brigade and is clean, dry and product free. Please only include those items permitted within each brigade.
