Go Active Football Club - Years 2-6 inclusive - today



Go Active football club starts today (session 1 of 5). 15 children have signed up which is fantastic and has enabled the club to go ahead. There are still a couple of available spaces should any children wish to join.



Red Class Swimming Lessons - this Friday

Red Class will start their swim lessons this Friday 20th April. Children will have ten lessons each on a Friday. Children will have a 45 minute lesson in Parc Eglos pool as having used this pool previously we feel it is well suited to this age group: being shallow throughout. Children will travel by coach and will return ready for collection at normal pick up time. All children will need: swimming costume & towel (goggles are optional but a swim hat is required to be worn if your child has long hair). We do have a small stock of swim hats if needed. A contribution of £3.00 per child per lesson is requested which can be paid weekly or in total (£30.00). Children are permitted to wear a tracksuit (navy) on swim days for ease of changing or school uniform. We regret that due to ever tightening budgets that children absent from a lesson will still need to cover the cost and would request that everyone pays a contribution. A consent form is being sent home today.

As part of their money topic work, Red Class will be making cakes (buns) this Friday and selling them for 20p each to the rest of the school. Children wishing to buy a bun should bring in some change on Friday.

Children's University Passport to Learning

Don't forget to update passports with hours and bring into school to be verified and stamped. Children can receive 1 stamp per activity per week: the idea behind the scheme is to encourage children to participate in as many different activities as possible. If you don't have a CU passport but would like one please pop along to the school office. There is lots of information on the school website (go to: Parents, Children's University).



On 30th June (Penryn Campus 2-4pm) there will be another graduation ceremony for children reaching 100 hours, please see the school office if you qualify. There is a booking deadline, therefore, if you think your child will have 100+ hours and would like to attend the graduation please let the school office know.

Breakfast Club - no pre-booking required

Available from 8.00am until 8.50am each school day. Daily charges are: £2.00 per child; £3.00 for two children or £5.00 for three children. Includes a choice of cereals, crumpets, toast, milk, fruit, juice, etc.



Is your child eligible for Free School Meals?

Your child may be eligible for free school meals if you (or the child themselves in their own right) are in receipt of any of the following benefits.

- Income Support (IS)
- Job Seekers' Allowance (Income-Based) and equal based Job Seekers Allowance.
- Income Related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA-IR) and equal based Employment and Support Allowance.
- Child Tax Credit (CTC) with an annual income of less than £16,190.
- Working Tax Credit run-on - paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Guarantee Element of Pension Credit (GPC)
- Immigration and Asylum Act 1999 (IAA) Support
- Universal Credit - if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

If your child is eligible for and getting free school meals at any time before 31 March 2022, they'll remain eligible until this date.

Please note that anyone claiming Working Tax Credit, Contribution-Based Job Seeker's Allowance and/or Contribution-Based Employment and Support Allowance is NOT eligible for free school meals, regardless of what other benefits/credits are being claimed. However, you will be temporarily eligible to claim free school meals if you receive a Working Tax Credit run-on, which is the payment someone may receive for a further four weeks after they stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit.

Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM)

All Key Stage 1 (Reception, Year 1 and Year 2) pupils are entitled to receive a free school meal as part of the Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM) initiative, regardless of what benefits are being claimed.

If you are in receipt of any of the benefits listed above which would entitle your child to free school meals anyway, your school may be entitled to claim Pupil Premium funding to support your child's education, just by you completing an application form.
